THE FOOD AND DRUG REGULATIONS 1946, AMENDMENT NO. 7

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Food and Drugs Act, 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Food and Drug Regulations 1946, Amendment No. 7, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Food and Drug Regulations 1946* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. While this regulation continues in force, the principal regulations shall be read as if there were inserted therein, after regulation 170, the following regulation :---

"170A. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in regulations 161 to 170 of these regulations, there may be added to fruit syrups, compound syrups, flavoured syrups, artificial syrups, and beverage flavours soluble saccharin in a proportion not exceeding 3 grains to the pint; and to fruit non-fermented beverages, flavoured non-fermented beverages, compound non-fermented beverages, and artificial nonfermented beverages soluble saccharin in a proportion not exceeding 1 grain to the pint; and the quantity of sugar required by any of the abovementioned regulations may be reduced."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations temporarily restore the permission (withdrawn in 1949) for limited quantities of saccharin to be included in cordials and non-fermented beverages. Foodstuffs containing saccharin are required by the principal regulations to be labelled "Contains Saccharin" in the prescribed manner.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act, 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 10th day of May, 1951. These regulations are administered in the Department of Health.
