HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 46 of the Food and Drug Act 1969, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Food and Drug Regulations 1973, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Food and Drug Regulations 1973* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1981.

2. Transitional provision—Regulation 253 (1) of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 38 of the Food and Drug Regulations 1973, Amendment No. 2) is hereby amended by omitting the expression “1981”, and substituting the expression “1984”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations are made pursuant to the Food and Drug Act 1969, and amend the Food and Drug Regulations 1973.

Regulation 1 relates to the Title and commencement.

Regulation 2, in effect, defers from 1 January 1981 to 1 January 1984 the date by which frozen foods must be stored before sale at -18°C . Until the date specified, the maximum temperature allowed is -12°C .
