



**THE FISHERIES (AUCKLAND AND KERMADEC AREAS
AMATEUR FISHING) REGULATIONS 1986, AMENDMENT NO. 5**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HER EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 89 of the Fisheries Act 1983, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (Auckland and Kermadec Areas Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (Auckland and Kermadec Areas Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Interpretation—Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the definition of the term “Auckland Fishery Management Area”, the following definition:

“‘Auckland Fishery Management Area (East)’ means all New Zealand fisheries waters within that portion of the Auckland Fishery Management Area enclosed by a line commencing at Cape Runaway on the east coast of the North Island (at 37° 32’S and 177° 59.4’E); then proceeding due north to a point 33° 25’S and 177° 59.4’E on the outer boundary of the exclusive economic zone; then proceeding in a generally north-westerly direction along the outer boundary of the exclusive economic zone to a point 30° 52.5’S and 173° 02.5’E on the outer boundary of the exclusive economic zone; then proceeding due south to North Cape on the north coast of the North Island (at 34° 24’S and 173° 02.5’E); then proceeding in a generally south-easterly direction along the mean high-water mark to the point of commencement; and including all inland waters lying north of a line drawn from Cape Runaway on the east coast of the North Island (at 37° 32’S and 177° 59.4’E) to Tirua Point on the west coast of the North Island (at 38° 23’S and 174° 38.5’E):”.

3. Maximum daily number of fish—(1) Regulation 3A of the principal regulations (as inserted by regulation 3 of the Fisheries (Auckland and Kermadec Areas Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 3 and amended by regulation 2 of the Fisheries (Auckland and Kermadec Areas Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 4) is hereby amended by revoking subclause (3), and substituting the following subclause:

“(3) No person shall, on any day, take from the Auckland and Kermadec Fishery Management Areas more than 30 grey mullet or possess more than 30 grey mullet taken from within those areas.”

(2) Regulation 3A of the principal regulations (as so inserted) is hereby further amended by adding the following subclauses:

“(6) No person shall, on any day, take from the Auckland and Kermadec Fishery Management Areas more than 15 snapper or possess more than 15 snapper taken from within those areas.

“(7) No person shall, on any day, take from the Auckland Fishery Management Area (East) more than 9 snapper or possess more than 9 snapper taken from within that area.”

(3) Regulation 2 of the Fisheries (Auckland and Kermadec Areas Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 4 is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, amend the Fisheries (Auckland and Kermadec Areas Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986 to alter the daily amateur bag limit for snapper in the Auckland and Kermadec Areas.

The existing limit for the combined areas is 15 snapper. That total limit remains the same, but the number of snapper that can be taken from the eastern part of the Auckland Fishery Management Area (as newly defined) is limited to 9.
