

THE FOOD ADDITIVES NOTICE 1971

Pursuant to section 46 (3) of the Food and Drug Act 1969, the Minister of Health hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

- 1. Title—This notice may be cited as the Food Additives Notice 1971.
- 2. Limits and additives varied—The Minister of Health hereby varies, for the period of 12 months beginning on the date of the notification of this notice in the *Gazette*, the quantities or proportions of specified things that may be contained in food, and, for the like period, permits the addition of specified things in specified proportions to food, to the extent that the provisions of the Schedules hereto are inconsistent with the provisions of the Food and Drug Regulations 1946*—

(a) In relation to the foods specified in the first column of the First

Schedule hereto, by:

(i) Substituting the proportions comprising arsenic and lead specified respectively in the second and third columns of that Schedule for the proportions comprising arsenic and lead specified in relation to the same foods in regulation 37 of the said regulations:

(ii) Adding, in relation to foods specified in the said regulation 37, the proportions comprising copper and zinc specified respectively in the fourth and fifth columns of that Schedule:

- (iii) Enabling arsenic, lead, copper, and zinc to be contained in foods not specified in the said regulation 37 in the proportions specified respectively in the second, third, fourth, and fifth columns of that Schedule:
- b) In relation to the foods specified in the second column of the Second Schedule hereto, by:
 - (i) Substituting the proportions specified respectively in the third column of that Schedule comprising residues of pesticides specified respectively in the first column of that Schedule for the proportions comprising those residues specified in subclause (3) of regulation 49B of the said regulations:

(ii) Adding the proportions specified respectively in the said third column comprising residues of pesticides specified respectively in the said first column but not specified in the said

subclause (3):

- (iii) Allowing the proportions specified respectively in the said third column comprising residues of pesticides specified respectively in the said first column to be contained in foods not specified in the said subclause (3):
- (c) By allowing the chemical contaminants specified in the first column of the Third Schedule hereto to be contained in foods of the kinds specified respectively in the second column of that Schedule in the proportions specified respectively in the third column of that Schedule:
- (d) By allowing the additives specified in the second column of the Fourth Schedule hereto to be added to vegetables and fruit of the kinds specified respectively in the first column of that Schedule in the proportions specified respectively in the third column of that Schedule.
