

THE FOOD ADDITIVES NOTICE 1980

Pursuant to section 46 (3) of the Food and Drug Act 1969, the Minister of Health hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

- 1. Title—This notice may be cited as the Food Additives Notice 1980.
- 2. Duration of notice—This notice shall have effect for the period of 12 months commencing with the day after the date of the notification of this notice in the *Gazette*.
- 3. Permitted substances in foods for which standards are prescribed—(1) Notwithstanding anything in the Food and Drug Regulations 1973*, any food specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this notice may contain not more than the quantities specified in the third column of that Schedule of the substances specified in the first column of that Schedule in relation to that food.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything in regulation 119 of the Food and Drug Regulations 1973* or in regulation 120A of those regulations (as inserted by regulation 13 of the Food and Drug Regulations 1973, Amendment No. 4†), flavoured milk and UHT (ultra heat treated) flavoured milk may contain added sugar, and carrageenan and its sodium, potassium, calcium, and ammonium compounds.
- 4. Permitted incidental constituents—Notwithstanding anything in regulation 24 (2) of the Food and Drug Regulations 1973*, any food specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to this notice may contain not more than the quantity specified in the third column of that Schedule of residue of the pesticide specified in the first column of that Schedule in relation to that food.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Stonefruit

..... Milk and Sugarbeet

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The notice permits the addition of sugar and carrageenan (a permitted food conditioner) to flavoured milk and UHT (ultra heat treated) flavoured milk, and the addition of sulphur dioxide to drink flavour and drink concentrate. It also introduces new maximum residue levels for some pesticides.

The notice will remain in force for 12 months.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in Gazette: 14 February 1980. This notice is administered in the Department of Health.
