THE FOOD ADDITIVES NOTICE (NO. 2) 1982

PURSUANT to section 46 (3) of the Food and Drug Act 1969, the Minister of Health hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

1. Title—This notice may be cited as the Food Additives Notice (No. 2) 1982.

2. Duration of notice—This notice shall have effect for the period of 12 months commencing with the day after the date of the notification of this notice in the *Gazette*.

3. Permitted substances in certain foods—Notwithstanding anything in the Food and Drug Regulations 1973*, the food specified in the second column of the Schedule to this notice may have added to it not more than the quantity specified in the third column of that Schedule of the substance specified in the first column of that Schedule in relation to that food.

PERMITTED ADDITIVE TO FOOD

Compound	Food	Permissible Proportion
Di-methyl-di-carbonate	Wine	200 mg per litre

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice permits the addition to wine of the yeast inhibitor di-methyl-di-carbonate in quantities not exceeding 200 milligrams per litre.

The notice will remain in force for 12 months.
