PURSUANT to the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1955, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Forest and Rural Fires Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Forest and Rural Fires Regulations 1956* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date

of their notification in the Gazette.

3. Regulation 16 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by

adding to paragraph (a) of subclause (1) the following proviso:

"Provided if any person has received training in fire fighting approved by the Fire Authority the rate payable shall not be less than the ordinary time rate prescribed from time to time by the Government Service Tribunal for a labourer employed by the New Zealand Forest Service."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The effect of these regulations is that persons under twenty-one years of age who have been trained in fire fighting will be paid at least the rate payable to a Forest Service labourer when engaged on actual fire-fighting operations.
