PURSUANT to section 89 of the Fisheries Act 1983, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (Southland and Sub-Antarctic Areas Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 14, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (Southland and Sub-Antarctic Areas Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1986* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1992.

2. Interpretation—Regulation 2 (1) of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 (1) of the Fisheries (Southland and Sub-Antarctic Areas Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 11) is hereby amended by inserting, after the definition of the term “queen scallop”, the following definition:

“ ‘Rat tail’ means a fish of the species *Coelorhynchus biclinozonalis* or a fish of the species *Coelorhynchus aspercephalis*.”

3. Targeting of certain fish, aquatic life, and seaweed prohibited, unless specially authorised—Regulation 15CA of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 5 of the Fisheries (Southland and Sub-Antarctic Areas Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 11) is hereby amended by revoking subclause (5), and substituting the following subclause:

“(5) The species and classes of fish, aquatic life, and seaweed to which subclause (1) of this regulation applies are as follows:

2. Any other fish, aquatic life, or seaweed, not being—

- (a) Fish, aquatic life, or seaweed that is subject to a quota management system; or
- (b) Fish, aquatic life, or seaweed specified in regulation 15c or regulation 15cb of these regulations; or
- (c) Fish, aquatic life, or seaweed specified in Part A of this Table.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 October 1992, amend the Fisheries (Southland and Sub-Antarctic Areas Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1986.

A new table of prohibited target species is substituted in regulation 15ca of the principal regulations, with the following changes:

- (a) Catseye, lamprey, limpet, mud crab, mud snail, New Zealand cancer crab, red rock crab, sea egg (other than kina), sea hare, sea slug, venerupis, and whelk are transferred from *Part A* (prohibited unless specially authorised) to *Part B* (totally prohibited);
- (b) Octopus is transferred from *Part B* to *Part A*;
- (c) Southern blue whiting is included in *Part B* but the prohibition applies only in quota management area 5. Rat tail is also included in *Part B*.
