

THE FISHING BOAT PERSONNEL (ENGINEERING) EXAMINATION REGULATIONS 1984, AMENDMENT NO. 1

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 19 and 504 of the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the recommendation of the Minister of Transport made after consultation by the Minister with organisations which appeared to the Minister to be representative of owners and seafarers, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fishing Boat Personnel (Engineering) Examination Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fishing Boat Personnel (Engineering) Examination Regulations 1984* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of

their notification in the Gazette.

2. First-class diesel trawler engineer—Regulation 13 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (d), and substituting the following paragraph:

"(d) Must be the holder of a certificate in survival skills approved by the

Secretary; and".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the requirements to be met by candidates for certificates as firstclass diesel trawler engineers. They substitute a requirement to hold an approved certificate in survival skills for the current requirement to be a certified lifeboatman within the meaning of the Shipping Lifesaving Appliance Rules 1968, which were revoked on 1 November 1989.
