- 1 Title**
These rules are the Family Courts Amendment Rules 2007.
- 2 Commencement**
These rules come into force on 1 August 2007.

3 Principal rules amended

These rules amend the Family Courts Rules 2002.

4 Amendments to forms in Schedule 9

- (1) Forms PPPR 3, 4, 7, 8, 12, and 13 in Schedule 9 are amended by omitting “20 years” in each place where it appears and substituting in each case “18 years”.
- (2) Form PPPR 5 in Schedule 9 is amended—
 - (a) by omitting “20 years” in each place where it appears and substituting in each case “18 years”; and
 - (b) by omitting “\$2,000” and substituting “\$5,000”.
- (3) Form PPPR 6 in Schedule 9 is amended—
 - (a) by omitting “20 years” in each place where it appears in both the items described as item 1 and substituting in each case “18 years”; and
 - (b) by omitting “\$2,000” and substituting “\$5,000”.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the rules, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These rules, which come into force on 1 August 2007, make changes to the Family Courts Rules 2002 consequential on—

- changes made by the Protection of Personal and Property Rights Order 2007 (which increases the value of an item of property in respect of which an order for administration of that property can be made under section 11 of the Protection of Personal and Property Rights Act 1988 from \$2,000 to \$5,000);
- changes made by the Care of Children Act 2004.
