THE FRUIT CONTROL ACT REAPPLICATION ORDER 1938.

Whereas by notice dated the 13th day of January, 1925, and published in the *Gazette* on the 15th day of January, 1925, at page 135, the Minister of Agriculture in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 4 of the Fruit Control Act, 1924 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), excluded the Provincial District of Otago from the operation of Part I of the said Act:

And whereas in pursuance of the provisions of section 2 of the Fruit Control Amendment Act, 1932 (hereinafter referred to as the said amending Act) a petition, signed by not less than 70 per centum of the producers carrying on business as such within the Provincial District of Otago and being occupiers of orchards from which not less than one hundred cases of fruit were exported during the then last preceding year, has been presented to the Minister of Agriculture praying that the provisions of Part I of the said Act be reapplied to the said provincial district, and was received by the Minister in the month of December, 1937:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to give effect to the prayer of the said petition accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, William Lee Martin, Minister of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by subsection (1) of section 2 of the said amending Act, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Fruit Control Act Reapplication Order 1938.
- 2. The provisions of Part I of the said Act are hereby reapplied to the Provincial District of Otago.
