ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington this 28th day of August, 1940.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Fruit-export Control Board Emergency Regulations 1940.

2. (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Fruit Control Act, 1924, the members of the New Zealand Fruit-export Control Board in office as producers' representatives on the coming into force of these regulations shall, unless their office is vacated otherwise than by effluxion of time, continue in office without reelection or reappointment during the pleasure of the Governor-General.

(2) If the office of any member of the said Board, being a producers' representative, becomes vacant at any time while these regulations are in force, the Governor-General, on the recommendation of the Minister of Marketing, may appoint a suitable person as his successor to hold office during pleasure as a producers' representative.
