

THE FISHERIES (DOUBLE COVE PROHIBITION) NOTICE 1983

PURSUANT to section 89 of the Fisheries Act 1983 and the Fisheries (Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1983, the Director-General of Agriculture and Fisheries hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Double Cove Prohibition) Notice 1983.
 - (2) This notice shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1984.
- 2. Interpretation—Words and expressions in this notice which are defined in the Fisheries Act 1983 and the Fisheries (Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1983 shall, unless the context otherwise requires, have the meanings so defined.
- **3. Double Cove fishing restrictions**—No person shall take, possess, or convey any finfish from Double Cove, being those waters of Queen Charlotte Sound inside a line from Nohokouau Point (at 41°14.4′ South and 174°0.5′ East) to the southernmost point of the peninsular (at 41°14.5′ South and 174°1.4′ East) lying between Double Cove and Torea Bay.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice prohibits the taking of finfish from the waters of Double Cove in Queen Charlotte Sound.
