THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Factories Act 1946 and the Royal Powers Act 1953, Her Majesty the Queen, acting by and with the advice and consent of Her Executive Council, is pleased to make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Factories Consolidating Regulations 1937, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Factories Consolidating Regulations 1937* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of

February 1954.
2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 23, the following regulation:

"23A. The fees for the registration of factories shall be as specified

in the Third Schedule hereto.'

(2) The principal regulations are hereby further amended by adding the following Schedule:
