PURSUANT to the Forests Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Forest Disease Control Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Forest Disease Control Regulations 1967\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Diseases**—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 3 and the First Schedule thereto.

**3. Specified forest diseases**—The Second Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding, after the reference to the Pine Bark Beetle, the following item:

“Pine Wood Wasp All species of the genus *Sirex*”.

**4. Sirex Advisory Committee**—The Sirex Advisory Committee Regulations 1950† and the Sirex Advisory Committee Regulations, Amendment No. 1,‡ are hereby consequentially revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

Regulation 2 revokes the Schedule of diseases affecting trees. These diseases are no longer required to be specified by Order in Council.

Regulations 3 and 4 enable the control of the Pine Wood Wasp to be dealt with under the principal regulations and revoke the Sirex Advisory Committee Regulations 1950.
