HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Forestry Encouragement Act 1962, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Forestry Encouragement Loans Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Forestry Encouragement Loans Regulations 1967* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. First Schedule—The First Schedule to the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 6 of the Forestry Encouragement Loans Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 2) is hereby amended—

- (a) By omitting from the item relating to normal maximum loan per hectare of loan area the expression "\$450", and substituting the expression "\$1,200":
- (b) By omitting from the item relating to Charging of Interest (as substituted by regulation 6 of the Forestry Encouragement Loans Regulations 1967, Amendment No. 3) the expression "4.5 percent", and substituting the expression "6.5 percent".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations

(a) Increase the maximum amount of loan available from \$450 per hectare to \$1,200 per hectare:

(b) Increase the rate of interest on such loans from 4.5 percent to 6.5 percent.
