# THE FINANCE EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1940, AMENDMENT NO. 8

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Continuance Act 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Finance Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 8, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Finance Emergency Regulations 1940 (No. 2)\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- 2. (1) Regulation 21 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:
- "(3) With respect to any offence against these regulations the period of six months prescribed by section 50 of the Justices of the Peace Act 1927 for the laying of an information shall not run while the person charged is outside New Zealand."
- (2) This regulation shall not apply with respect to offences committed before the commencement of these regulations.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations relate to future offences against the Finance Emergency Regulations 1940 (No. 2), and provide that the period of six months within which proceedings may be commenced is not to run while the person charged is outside New Zealand.
