THE FIRE EXTINGUISHERS REGULATIONS 1958. AMENDMENT NO. 1

Pursuant to the Health Act 1956, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Fire Extinguishers Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fire Extinguishers Regulations 1958* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting in the definition of the term "pressurised fire extinguisher", after the words "halogenated compound", the words "(other than Freon)".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The effect of these regulations is to exclude from the definition of "pressurised fire extinguisher" in the principal regulations an extinguisher containing Freon. It will accordingly be lawful to sell for use in any dwellinghouse a fire extinguisher containing Freon under pressure.
