PURSUANT to section 49 of the Meat Act 1981, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fish (Packing for Export) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fish (Packing for Export) Regulations 1977* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1983.

2. Manner of processing rock lobster tails at sea—(1) Regulation 79 (1) of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Fish (Packing for Export) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 3) is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (f).

(2) Regulation 79 (1A) of the principal regulations (as inserted by the said regulation 2) is hereby revoked.

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(3) Regulation 2 (2) of the Fish (Packing for Export) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 3 is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations remove the requirement (to come into effect on 1 October 1983) that rock lobsters tailed at sea are to be reduced to and held at a temperature of -18°C before delivery to a fish packing house.
