



**THE FISH (PACKING FOR EXPORT) REGULATIONS 1977,
AMENDMENT NO. 5**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Meat Act 1981, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fish (Packing for Export) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fish (Packing for Export) Regulations 1977* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Revocation of regulations relating to certification of fish for export—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking

regulation 75 (as amended by regulation 18 of the Fish (Packing for Export) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 2) and regulation 76.

(2) Regulation 90 (2) of the principal regulations is hereby consequentially amended by omitting the expression “75 (1) and (4), 76 (3) and (4),”.

(3) Regulation 90 (4) of the principal regulations is hereby consequentially amended by omitting the expression “76 (3),”.

(4) Regulation 18 of the Fish (Packing for Export) Regulations 1977, Amendment No. 2 is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Fish (Packing for Export) Regulations 1977 by revoking regulation 75 (certification of fish for export) and regulation 76 (certificate may be withdrawn).

The amendments enable the replacement of the requirement for a compulsory single form of certification with a more flexible system suited to varying overseas market certification requirements.

The regulations come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
