



**THE FISHERIES (CONVERSION FACTORS) NOTICE 1986,
AMENDMENT NO. 2**

PURSUANT to section 3A(2) of the Fisheries Act 1983, the Minister of Fisheries, acting after consultation with the Fishing Industry Board, hereby gives the following notice.

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NOTICE

1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Conversion Factors) Notice 1986, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (Conversion Factors) Notice 1986* (hereinafter referred to as the principal notice).

(2) This notice shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1989.

2. Alteration of headed and gutted conversion factor for orange roughy—The table in the Schedule to the principal notice is hereby amended by omitting from the item relating to orange roughy the expression "1.92" (which appears in the fourth column of the table), and substituting the expression "2.00".

3. Alteration to hoki surimi conversion factor—The Schedule to the principal notice is hereby amended by revoking the item relating to the conversion factor for surimi or fish paste (being the fourth item below the table in that Schedule), and substituting the following items:

"The conversion factor for surimi or fish paste is 4.30 for all species or classes of fish other than hoki.

"The conversion factor for surimi or fish paste is 5.80 for hoki."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice, which comes into force on 1 October 1989, alters certain conversion factors for orange roughy and hoki surimi.

The conversion factor for headed and gutted orange roughy is changed from 1.92 to 2.0.

The conversion factor for hoki surimi is changed from 4.3 to 5.8. Other surimi conversion factors are unchanged.
