**THE FRESH-WATER FISHERIES (SOUTHLAND) REGULATIONS  
1937, AMENDMENT NO. 1.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 21st day of

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Fresh-water Fisheries (Southland) Regulations 1937, Amendment No. 1.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Fresh-water Fisheries (Southland) Regulations 1937\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1938.

4. Regulation 15 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following regulations substituted:—

“ 15. During the period from the 1st day of October, 1938, until the 30th day of September, 1939, both days inclusive, no person shall fish for, take, or kill any acclimatized fish by any method whatsoever in the following waters, namely—

“ (a) Upokororo River;

“ (b) That portion of Lake Te Anau lying east of a straight line drawn from Blue Gum Point to the mouth of the first creek above Lookout Hill.

“ 15A. No person shall during the month of October in any year fish for, take, or kill any acclimatized fish in—

“ (a) Lake Te Anau;

“ (b) Lake Manapouri; or

“ (c) That portion of the Waiau River between Lake Te Anau and Lake Manapouri.”
