



**THE FRESH-WATER FISHERIES (SOUTHLAND)
REGULATIONS 1941, AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Fresh-water Fisheries (Southland) Regulations 1941, Amendment No. 1.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Fresh-water Fisheries (Southland) Regulations 1941 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. Regulation 20 of the principal regulations is amended by adding at the end thereof the following additional clauses :—

“(c) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this regulation, any woman or person under sixteen years of age fishing for acclimatized fish in the district and holding the appropriate license may use worm or creeper as a bait or lure in the waters named in clause (d) of this regulation :

“(d) The waters referred to in clause (c) of this regulation are the following :—

“(1) The Orawia Stream :

“(2) The tributaries of the Orawia Stream.”
