**THE FRESHWATER FISHERIES REGULATIONS 1951,  
AMENDMENT No. 1**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington, this 19th day of  
September 1951

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause as subclause (2) thereof:—

“(2) Every such notice shall be read together with and deemed part of the regulations modified by the notice.”

3. Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclauses:—

“(6) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (5) of this regulation, the holder of any licence for the time being current issued under the Rotorua Trout Fishing Regulations 1951† may during the open season in the Hawke's Bay Acclimatization District fish for, take, and kill acclimatized fish in the waters or from the bank of that portion of the Mohaka River that lies within the Hawke's Bay Acclimatization District and is opposite the boundary between that district and the Rotorua Trout Fishing District in accordance with these regulations and all local regulations in force at that place at that time.

“(7) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this regulation, where regulations in force in any district specified in subclause (1) of this regulation provide that licences issued under these regulations shall be available in that district, the licences shall be available accordingly.”

4. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule, and substituting the First Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 22 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following proviso:—

“ Provided that any society whose district is in the North Island may, with the written consent of the Minister, issue whole season licences to *bona fide* residents of its district at the appropriate fees set out in that Schedule in respect of whole season licences issued in the South Island.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations make miscellaneous amendments to the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951.

Regulation 7 of the principal regulations empowers the Minister of Marine to modify those regulations in relation to the duration of the open and close seasons, bag limits, weight limits, or methods of fishing. Regulation 2 of these regulations declares any such modification notice to be part of the principal regulations, so that any failure to comply with the provisions of the notice will constitute a breach of the principal regulations.

Regulation 3 provides for licences issued under the Rotorua Trout Fishing Regulations 1951 to be available in the Hawke's Bay Acclimatization District in that part of the Mohaka River that forms the boundary between the two districts.

Regulation 4 (1) substitutes a new scale of licence fees. The new scale differs from the existing scale only in respect of whole season licences issued in the North Island. The other fees remain the same. Under subclause (2) North Island societies may continue to issue licences at the old rates to *bona fide* residents of their districts.
