**THE FRESHWATER FISHERIES REGULATIONS 1951,  
AMENDMENT NO. 3**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington this 5th day of October 1955

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Regulation 10 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the words "and, if issued after the 30th day of April 1956, shall contain only such other matter as the Secretary for Marine from time to time prescribes or approves".

3. Regulations 29, 30, and 31 of the principal regulations and the Fifth and Sixth Schedules to those regulations are hereby revoked.

4. Regulation 89 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the word "acclimatized".

5. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule (as substituted by regulation 4 (1) of the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the First Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 13 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "for persons other than youths".

(3) Regulation 14 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "Licences for youths and".

(4) Regulation 22 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "sixth and seventh", and substituting the words "and sixth".

(5) Subclause (1) of regulation 4 of the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 1, and the Schedule to those regulations are hereby revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations make miscellaneous amendments to the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951.

Regulation 10 of the principal regulations specifies the form of licence which may be issued. Regulation 2 of these regulations provides that any other details printed on licence forms, such as summaries of local regulations, require the approval of the Secretary for Marine.

Regulations 29, 30, and 31 of the principal regulations provided for the forwarding to the Secretary for Marine of a statement showing the various classes of fishing licences issued, and an audited certificate or, in the case of a society whose fishing licence revenue is less than £50, a signed statement from society officials. These requirements are now contained in the Wildlife Act 1953 and the Wildlife Regulations 1955 and in consequence they are revoked by regulation 3 of this amendment.

Regulation 89 of the principal regulations permits the taking and holding of acclimatized fish for scientific purposes by any person authorized by the Secretary for Marine. Regulation 4 of these regulations permits the taking, with the authority of the Secretary for Marine, of any fish, whether indigenous or acclimatized, for pisciculture or scientific investigation.

The First Schedule to the principal regulations defines licence fees and the classes of licences which may be issued. Regulation 5 of this amendment revokes the provision for the issue of youths' licences, but raises the age for children's licences from under sixteen to under seventeen years of age, or over that age if still attending school full time, and reduces the fee for a day licence from 3s. 6d. to 2s. 6d.
