



**THE FRESHWATER FISHERIES REGULATIONS 1983,
AMENDMENT NO. 8**

PURSUANT to sections 48 and 48A of the Conservation Act 1987, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title, commencement, and application—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 8, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1983* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1990.

(3) These regulations shall apply in respect of all licences issued in respect of any period commencing on or after the 1st day of July 1990.

2. Expenditure of licence fees—Regulation 16 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (a), and substituting the following paragraph:

“(a) The payment to the New Zealand Fish and Game Council of any levy determined by that Council under section 26c (1) (f) of the Conservation Act 1987:”.

3. New Schedule of licence fees substituted—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 7), and substituting the new Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) The Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 7 are hereby consequentially revoked.

4. Revocations of provisions requiring payments to Consolidated Account and Island Councils—(1) Regulations 17 and 18 of the principal regulations are hereby revoked.

(2) Regulation 2 (3) of the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 6 is hereby consequentially revoked.

LICENCES AND FEES

1. Fees for general licence: Such licences if whole season or week are available throughout New Zealand except in the Eastern Fish and Game Region and the Taupo District. Day licences are available only in the Region or District of issue.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 1990, increase most of the fees for general licences to fish for sports fish and for licences to fish for sports fish in the Eastern Fish and Game Region. In some cases the licence fee has been reduced. The new fees are inclusive of goods and services tax.

The regulations also revoke provisions that require acclimatisation societies to pay to the Consolidated Account and the appropriate Council of Acclimatisation Societies a proportion of their licence revenue. This revocation is consequential on the abolition of acclimatisation societies by section 74 of the Conservation Law Reform Act 1990.
