Pursuant to section 89 of the Fisheries Act 1983, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 12, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1986* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) Except as provided in subclause (3) of this regulation, these regulations shall come into force on the 14th day of August 1992.

- (3) Regulation 2 of these regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1992.
- 2. Apertures to be incorporated in rock lobster pots—Regulation 54 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 4 of the Fisheries (Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 11) is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:

"(6) Nothing in this regulation shall prohibit the use of a rock lobster pot for holding rock lobsters so long as the pot is not capable of being used for

taking rock lobsters."

3. Second Schedule amended—The Second Schedule to the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Fisheries (Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 9) is hereby amended by revoking Part I, and substituting the Part I set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations permit the use of rock lobster pots used only to hold rock lobsters and increase certain fees payable in respect of fishing permits issued under the Fisheries Act 1986.

Regulation 2 effects the amendment relating to rock lobster pots and comes into force on 1 October 1992.

Regulation 3 effects the increases to fees and comes into force on 14 August 1992. The changes are as follows:

- (a) An administration fee of \$10.13 is imposed for each authorisation to take a non-quota management system fishstock from a particular area on or after 14 August 1992. This fee does not apply to permits under Part IIA of the Act:
- (b) The initial fee for an application for a special permit under section 64 of the Act is increased from \$150 to \$900 but is reduced to \$225 where the application is processed within 4 hours:
- (c) The fee for the amendment or alteration of a special permit under section 64 of the Act is increased from \$15 to \$56.25.

All the fees prescribed by these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.
