



**FISHERIES (LICENSED FISH RECEIVERS) AMENDMENT
REGULATIONS 1997**

PURSUANT to section 89 of the Fisheries Act 1983, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Amendment Regulations 1997, and are part of the Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986* (“the principal regulations”).

(2) These regulations come into force on 1 October 1997.

2. Renewals—Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is revoked.

3. Duration of licences and certificates—The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation 9 (as substituted by regulation 5 of the Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 5), and substituting the following regulation:

“9. Every fish receiver’s licence, and every certificate of recognition, continues to have effect until—

“(a) In the case of a certificate of recognition, the holder ceases to hold a current fish export licence or fish packing house licence; or

“(b) The licence or certificate is revoked by the Director-General or is surrendered,—

whichever first occurs.

4. Revocation of licences and certificates—Regulation 10 (1) (b) of the principal regulations is amended by omitting the words “or its renewal”, and also the words “or renewed”.

5. Fees—The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation 12.

6. Consequential revocations—The following regulations are revoked:

(a) The Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 1:

(c) Regulations 5 and 7 of the Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 5.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 October 1997, amend the Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986. Under those regulations, a person who holds a fish receiver's licence or a certificate of recognition is required to renew it every year and to pay the required renewal fee by 1 October, the beginning of the fishing year.

These regulations remove the need for annual renewal of fish receivers' licences and certificates of recognition. Licences and certificates will now continue in force until surrendered or revoked, or until their holder ceases to hold a current fish export licence or fish packing house licence.

The need to pay application and annual renewal fees is also removed (but see *regulation 9* of the Fisheries (Cost Recovery Levies) Order 1997).
