THE FRESHWATER FISHERIES REGULATIONS (HAWKE'S BAY) MODIFICATION NOTICE 1955

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act 1908 and the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951, the Minister of Marine hereby gives notice as follows.

NOTICE

1. This notice may be cited as the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations (Hawke's Bay) Modification Notice 1955.

2. This notice shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

3. This notice shall be in force only within the Hawke's Bay Acclimatization District.

4. The Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951* are hereby modified as follows:

Limit Bag

- (a) No person shall on any one day take or kill more than fifteen acclimatized fish:

Size Limit

- (b) No person shall take or kill in any manner whatever or intentionally have in his possession any acclimatized fish that does not exceed—
- (i) In the case of a rainbow trout, 12 in.:
 - (ii) In the case of a brown trout or a perch, 10 in.:

Restrictions on Lures and Methods

- (c) No person in fishing for acclimatized fish shall—
- (i) Use any lure or bait other than artificial fly or artificial minnow:
 - (ii) Use any lure or bait other than artificial fly in the Maharakiki, Mangaone, Maraetotara, or Tukipo Rivers, or any tributary of any such rivers:
 - (iii) Tow or troll any lure from any mechanically propelled or mechanically drawn boat in Lake Tutira:
 - (iv) Tow or troll any lure or bait from a moving boat or launch in that part of Lake Tutira within a radius of 100 yards from the centre of the meeting line of Sandy Creek and Lake Tutira.

5. The Freshwater Fisheries Regulations (Hawke's Bay) Modification Notice 1952* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.]

Except as varied by Modification Notices of local application, the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951 provide, *inter alia*, that—

- (a) The *limit bag*, which is the maximum number of acclimatized fish to be taken by one person in any day computed from midnight to midnight, shall be twenty;
- (b) The *size limit*, which is the minimum size of fish lawfully takeable, measured from tip of nose to tip of tail, shall be 9 in. for trout and salmon. Undersized fish must be released unharmed and are not reckoned in the limit bag;
- (c) Only artificial or natural fly, insect, worm, crustacea, or fish are lawful lures or baits for acclimatized fish. Shellfish (mollusca) and fish roe are illegal. Not more than two lures or baits may be used. Artificial flies, which include feathered lures, must have only one hook. In waters restricted to fly, no weight or loaded lure is permitted. Any weight must be affixed above any lure or bait, and, with artificial minnow (which includes spoon), at least 15 in. above.

This notice modifies the provisions of the general regulations in the Hawke's Bay Acclimatization District by reducing the limit bag to fifteen acclimatized fish, increasing the size limit to 12 in. for rainbow trout and 10 in. for other fish, and imposing restrictions on lures and methods of fishing in waters specified in this notice.
