THE FRESHWATER FISHERIES REGULATIONS (WELLINGTON) MODIFICATION NOTICE 1951

Pursuant to the Fisheries Act 1908, and the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951, the Minister of Marine hereby gives notice as follows.

NOTICE

- 1. This notice may be cited as the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations (Wellington) Modification Notice 1951.
- 2. This notice shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- 3. This notice shall be in force only within the Wellington Acclimatization District.
- 4. The Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951* are hereby modified as follows:—

Limit Baq

(a) No person shall on any one day take or kill more than twenty acclimatized fish, of which not more than twelve may be trout:

Size Limit

- (b) No person shall take or kill in any manner whatever or intentionally have in his possession any acclimatized fish that does not exceed—
 - (i) In the case of any trout taken from the Kaiwarra Stream, the South Karori Stream, or the Korokoro Stream, 9 in .
 - (ii) In the case of any trout taken from any water other than those waters specified in subparagraph (i) hereof, 11 in.:
 - (iii) In the case of any perch, 6 in.:

Restrictions on Lures and Methods

- (c) No person in fishing for acclimatized fish shall use-
 - (i) Any gaff:
 - (ii) Any sinker of a greater weight than 1 oz., unless he is fishing for perch in the Tauherenikau River below the Featherston-Martinborough Road Bridge, the Ruamahunga River below the Kahutara Road Bridge, or in Lake Wairarapa or the lagoons adjacent thereto:
 - (iii) In any river or water specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto any lure or bait other than a lure or bait specified against that river or water in column 2 of that Schedule:

Aorangi Bridge), Waiohine (down to main North Road bridge), Waingawa (down to main North Road bridge) Hutt River (between entrances of Akatarawa and Belmont Artificial fly, arti-Stream) ficial or natural minnow.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.]

Except as varied by Modification Notices of local application, the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951 provide, inter alia, that—

(a) The limit bag, which is the maximum number of acclimatized fish to be taken by one person in one day computed from midnight to midnight, shall be twenty:

(b) The size limit, which is the minimum size of fish lawfully takeable, measured from tip of nose to tip of tail, shall be 9 in. for trout and salmon. Undersized fish must be released unharmed and are not reckoned in the limit bag:

(c) Only artificial or natural fly, insect, worm, crustacea, or fish are lawful lures or baits for acclimatized fish. Shell fish (mollusca) and fish roe are illegal. Not more than two lures or baits may be used. Artificial flies, which include feathered lures, must have only one hook. In waters restricted to fly no weight or loaded lure is permitted. Any weight must be affixed above any lure or bait and, with artificial minnow (which includes spoon), at least 15 in. above.

This notice modifies the general regulations in the Wellington Acclimatization District by providing that the bag limit of twenty fish is not to include more than twelve trout, increasing the size limit in respect of fish taken in certain waters, and restricting the lures and methods that may be used in certain waters.
