THE FRESHWATER FISHERIES REGULATIONS (WESTLAND) MODIFICATION NOTICE 1965

Pursuant to the Fisheries Act 1908 and the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951, and, in relation to clause 4 (d) and (e) hereof, on the written application of the Westland Acclimatisation Society, the Minister of Marine hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

- 1. This notice may be cited as the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations (Westland) Modification Notice 1965.
- 2. This notice shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.
- 3. This notice shall be in force only within the Westland Acclimatisation District.
- 4. The Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951* are hereby modified as follows:

Limit Bag

- (a) No person shall on any one day take or kill—
 - (i) More than 4 salmon; or
 - (ii) More than 10 trout:

Size Limit

- (b) No person shall take or kill in any manner whatever or intentionally have in his possession any acclimatised fish that does not exceed—
 - (i) In the case of any salmon, 12 in. in length:
 - (ii) In the case of any trout, 9 in. in length:
 - (iii) In the case of any perch, 6 in. in length:

Open Season Exceptions

- (c) No person shall fish at any time for acclimatised fish—
 - (i) In any stream flowing into Lake Wahapo or Lake Mapourika:
 - (ii) In the stream flowing from Lake Wahapo into the Okarito River:

Open Season Extensions

(d) There shall be an open season for perch from the 1st day of October to the 30th day of April in the year next following (both dates inclusive) and from the 1st day of June to the 30th day of September in the same year (both dates inclusive) at Lake Mahinapua:

(e) There shall be an open season from the 1st day of October to the 30th day of April in the year next following (both dates inclusive) and from the 1st day of September to the 30th day of September in the same year (both dates inclusive) in the

following waters:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect. Except as varied by Modification Notices of local application, the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951 provide, inter alia, that—

(a) The limit bag, which is the maximum number of acclimatised fish to be taken by one person in one day computed from midnight to midnight, shall be 50:

(b) The size limit, which is the minimum size of fish lawfully takeable, measured from tip of nose to tip of tail, shall be 6 in. for trout and salmon. Undersized fish must be released unharmed and are not reckoned

in the limit bag:

(c) Only artificial or natural fly, insect, worm, crustacea, or fish are lawful lures or baits for acclimatised fish. Shellfish (mollusca) and fish roe are illegal. Not more than two lures or baits may be used. Artificial flies, which include feathered lures, must have only one hook. In waters restricted to fly, no weight or loaded lure is permitted. Any weight must be affixed above any lure or bait, and, with artificial minnow (which includes spoon), at least 15 in. above:
(d) The duration of the open season for acclimatised fish is from 1 October

to 30 April.

This notice modifies the provisions of the general regulations in the Westland Acclimatisation District by reducing the number of salmon and trout in a limit bag to four of salmon and 10 of trout, by modifying the size limit, restricting the operation of the open season in certain waters, as specified in this notice, extending the duration of the open season for perch in Lake Mahinapua, and extending the open season for acclimatised fish on certain rivers.
