PURSUANT to section 89 of the Fisheries Act 1983, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
 - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1989.
- 2. Fees—(1) Regulation 12 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 2 (1) of the Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 1) is hereby amended—
 - (a) By omitting from subclause (1) the expression "\$275", and substituting the expression "\$281.25":

1989/158 Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 2

(b) By omitting from subclause (2) the expression "\$176, and \$27.50", and substituting the expression "\$180, and \$28.25".

(2) Regulation 2 (1) of the Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 1 is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 1989, increase fees in respect of fish receivers' licences to reflect the increase in goods and services tax from 10 percent to 12.5 percent.
