PURSUANT to section 89 of the Fisheries Act 1983, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1991.
- 2. Fees—(1) Regulation 12 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 2 (1) of the Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 2) is hereby amended—

- (a) By omitting from subclause (1) the expression "\$281.25", and substituting the expression \$315.00":
- (b) By omitting from subclause (2) the expression "\$180, and \$28.25", and substituting the expression "\$200.00, and \$30.00".
- (2) The Fisheries (Licensed Fish Receivers) Regulations 1986. Amendment No. 2 are hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 October 1991, increase fees in respect of fish receivers' licences by approximately 12 percent to reflect movements in inflation during the period to which the former fees applied.
