**THE FRESH-WATER FISHERIES REGULATIONS (HAWERA,
STRATFORD, TARANAKI, AND WANGANUI) MODIFICA-
TION NOTICE 1950**

Wellington, 8th February, 1950.

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act, 1908, and the Fresh-water Fisheries Regulations 1936, I, William Stanley Goosman, Minister of Marine, do hereby give notice as follows :—

1. This notice may be cited as the Fresh-water Fisheries Regulations (Hawera, Stratford, Taranaki, and Wanganui) Modification Notice 1950.

2. This notice shall come in force on the day of the notification thereof in the *Gazette*.

3. The Fresh-water Fisheries Regulations 1936* (hereinafter referred to as the said regulations) are hereby modified in respect of the operation thereof in the Hawera, Stratford, Taranaki, and Wanganui Acclimatization Districts (hereinafter referred to as the said districts) as follows :—

(a) Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation 44 of the said regulations,—

(i) No person shall use worms, huhu grubs, or koura as a lure or bait in fishing for acclimatized fish in any of the said districts; and

(ii) In the case of the waters specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto, no person shall use, in fishing for acclimatized fish, any lure or bait other than those respectively set forth opposite thereto in the second column of the said schedule.

(b) Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation 47 of the said regulations, it shall be unlawful for any one person on any one day to take or kill more than ten trout in any one or more of the said districts.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation 48 of the said regulations it shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, or kill anywhere within the said districts any trout which does not exceed 13 in. in length from tip of nose to tip of tail :

Provided always that any person unintentionally taking a trout which does not exceed 13 in. in length from tip of nose to tip of tail who immediately returns it alive with as little injury as possible into the waters from which it was taken shall in respect of that trout be deemed not to have committed an offence under the said regulations.

(d) Notwithstanding anything contained in the said regulations, no person shall fish for, take, or kill any acclimatized fish in or from any waters within the Egmont National Park Reserve.
