**THE FREEZING INDUSTRY EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1940,  
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL.**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 6th day of  
May, 1942.

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Freezing Industry Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 1.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and deemed part of the Freezing Industry Emergency Regulations 1940\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) By revoking clause (1) thereof, and substituting the following clause :—

“(1) There shall be established at each works a Works Efficiency Council comprising four representatives of the union and two representatives of the management of the works. In addition, the district union secretary shall, *ipso facto*, be a member of the Council.”

(b) By inserting, next after clause (3) thereof, the following clauses :—

“(3A) When any matter is before the Council both the management and the union shall have the right to call evidence.

“(3B) Except in cases of urgency, either side desiring to bring any matter before the Council, shall give at least 48 hours' notice thereof to the other side.”

4. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is amended—

- (a) By revoking the words “settle any disputes that may arise in the industry” in clause (2) thereof, and substituting the following words: “deal with any matters that may arise affecting the promotion or maintenance of harmonious relationships between employers and workers in the industry”.
- (b) By revoking the words “a dispute” in clause (3) thereof, and substituting the words “any such matter”.
- (c) By revoking the word “dispute” wherever that word occurs in clauses (4), (5), and (6), and substituting the word “matter”.
