ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 11th day of March 1991

Present:

HER EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 280c of the Fisheries Act 1983, Her Excellency the Governor-General, on the recommendation of the Minister of Fisheries made in accordance with the requirements of section 280d of that Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This may be cited as the Fisheries (Rock Lobster Total Allowable Commercial Catch) Order 1991.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1991.

2. Reduction in total allowable commercial catch—The Maori Fisheries Act 1989 is hereby amended by repealing the Second Schedule (as amended by section 57 (7) of the Fisheries Amendment Act 1990), and substituting the Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to this order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 April 1991, reduces the total allowable commercial catch for spiny rock lobster in all quota management areas other than the Chatham Islands area by approximately 8 percent.

The total allowable commercial catch for the Chatham Islands remains unchanged at 503 tonnes.

The total allowable commercial catch for packhorse rock lobster in all New Zealand fisheries waters remains unchanged at 27 tonnes.
