ORDER IN COUNCIL

HER EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 280c of the Fisheries Act 1983, Her Excellency the Governor-General, on the recommendation of the Minister of Fisheries made in accordance with section 28D of that Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Fisheries (Rock Lobster Total Allowable Commercial Catch) Order 1996.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1996.

2. Increase in total allowable commercial catch—The Maori Fisheries Act 1989 is hereby amended by repealing the Second Schedule (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Fisheries (Rock Lobster Total Allowable Commercial Catch) Order 1993), and substituting the Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to this order.

3. Revocation—The Fisheries (Rock Lobster Total Allowable Commercial Catch) Order 1993 (S.R. 1993/47) is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 April 1996, fixes the total allowable commercial catch for spiny rock lobster in the various quota management areas and the total allowable commercial catch for packhorse rock lobster in all New Zealand fisheries waters.

The only change from the existing 1993 order is an increase in the total allowable commercial catch for the Gisborne area from 163.748 tonnes to 204.685 tonnes.
