PURSUANT to section 280c of the Fisheries Act 1983, and section 28 (j) of the Acts Interpretation Act 1924, His Excellency the Governor-General, on the recommendation of the Minister of Fisheries, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Fisheries (Rock Lobster Total Allowable Commercial Catch) Order 1996, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (Rock Lobster Total Allowable Commercial Catch) Order 1996* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Total allowable commercial catch—The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the figure “204.685” where it appears in relation to the Gisborne quota management area, and substituting the figure “204.895”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order corrects an error in the total allowable commercial catch set for the Gisborne rock lobster fishery by the Fisheries (Total Allowable Commercial Catch) Order 1996.

The figure originally set did not include an amount of 169 kilograms by which the previous total allowable commercial catch was deemed to be increased by virtue of a decision of the Quota Appeal Authority.

This amendment now includes that figure, plus the appropriate proportionate increase that the earlier order applied to the Gisborne fishery.
