



**THE FISHERIES (JACK MACKEREL QUOTA MANAGEMENT
AREAS, TOTAL ALLOWABLE CATCHES, AND CATCH
HISTORIES) NOTICE (NO. 2) 1987**

PURSUANT to sections 28B and 28C of the Fisheries Act 1983, the Minister of Fisheries, acting after consultation with the Fishing Industry Board, and after allowing for the matters specified in section 28C, hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Jack Mackerel Quota Management Areas, Total Allowable Catches, and Catch Histories) Notice (No. 2) 1987.

(2) This notice shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Interpretation—(1) In this notice—

“The Act” means the Fisheries Act 1983;

“Jack mackerel” means the fish of which the scientific name is *Trachurus spp.*;

“Part Auckland (East), Central (East) Area”—

(a) Means all New Zealand fisheries waters enclosed by a line commencing at North Cape on the north coast of the North Island (at 34°24'S and 173°02.5'E); then proceeding due north to a point 30°52.5'S and 173°02.5'E on the outer boundary of the exclusive economic zone; then proceeding in a generally south-easterly direction along the outer boundary of the exclusive economic zone to its intersection with the 42°10'S parallel of latitude; then proceeding due west along latitude 42°10'S to a point 42°10'S and 174°42'E; then proceeding in a generally north-westerly direction to Brothers Island light at 41°06'S and 174°26'E; then proceeding in an easterly direction to a point 41°06'S and 174°50'E on the west coast of the North Island; then proceeding in generally southerly, easterly, northerly, and then westerly directions along the mean highwater mark to the point of commencement; and

(b) Includes all internal waters of the North Island—

(i) Lying north and north-west of a line drawn from Cape Runaway on the east coast of the North Island (at

- 37°32'S and 177°59.4'E) to Tirua Point on the west coast of the North Island (at 38°23'S and 174°38.5'E); or
- (ii) Lying south and east of a line drawn from Cape Runaway on the east coast of the North Island (at 37°32'S and 177°59.4'E) to a point 41°06'S and 174°50'E on the west coast of the North Island; but
- (c) Does not include any waters, being part of the territorial sea of New Zealand or of the internal waters of New Zealand, that lie to the north of 36°S:

“South-East, Southland, Sub-Antarctic Area”—

- (a) Means all New Zealand fisheries waters within—
- (i) The South-East Fishery Management Area; or
 - (ii) The Southland Fishery Management Area; or
 - (iii) The Sub-Antarctic Fishery Management Area; and
- (b) Includes all internal waters of—
- (i) The Chatham Islands; or
 - (ii) The South Island and Stewart Island lying east, south, and south-west of a line drawn from Clarence Point on the east coast of the South Island (at 42°10'S and 173°56'E) to Awarua Point on the west coast of the South Island (at 44°16'S and 168°03'E); or
 - (iii) The islands within the Sub-Antarctic Fishery Management Area.

(2) In this notice a reference to a named fishery management area is a reference to the area of that name as defined in the notice published in the *Gazette* of 1986 at page 412.

3. Quota management areas—The taking of jack mackerel in the quota management areas specified in the Schedule to this notice is hereby declared to be subject to the quota management system under Part IIA of the Act on and from the 23rd day of October 1987.

4. Total allowable catches—The total allowable catch to be available for jack mackerel in respect of each quota management area to which this notice relates is as stated in the final column of the Schedule to this notice alongside the reference to that area.

5. Period to be used to determine provisional maximum individual transferable quotas—The period to be used under section 28E(1) of the Act in determining provisional maximum individual transferable quotas for jack mackerel in respect of each quota management area to which this notice relates is the fishing year commencing on the 1st day of October 1986.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice brings the taking of jack mackerel in 2 specified areas under the quota management system under Part IIA of the Fisheries Act 1986 on and from 23 October 1987.

The 2 quota management areas are:

- (a) Part Auckland (East), Central (East) Area:
- (b) South-East, Southland, Sub-Antarctic Area.

A total allowable catch of 5,970 greenweight tonnes is fixed for the Part Auckland (East), Central (East) Area and a total allowable catch of 2,700 greenweight tonnes is fixed for the South-East, Southland, Sub-Antarctic Area.

The fishing year commencing 1 October 1986 is fixed as the period to be used in determining maximum individual transferable quotas for jack mackerel in respect of the areas to which this notice relates.
