

## THE FISHERIES (JACK MACKEREL QUOTA MANAGEMENT AREAS, TOTAL ALLOWABLE CATCHES, AND CATCH HISTORIES) NOTICE (NO. 2) 1987, AMENDMENT NO. 1

Pursuant to section 28c of the Fisheries Act 1983, the Minister of Fisheries hereby gives the following notice.

## NOTICE

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Jack Mackerel Quota Management Areas, Total Allowable Catches, and Catch Histories) Notice (No. 2) 1987, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (Jack Mackerel Quota Management Areas, Total Allowable Catches, and Catch Histories) Notice (No. 2) 1987\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal notice).
  - (2) This notice shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1993.
- **2. Total allowable catches for jack mackerel increased**—The Schedule to the principal notice is hereby amended by omitting the expressions "5,970" and "2,700", and substituting, respectively, the expressions "8 000" and "9 000".

## Fisheries (Jack Mackerel Quota Management Areas, Total Allowable Catches, and Catch Histories) Notice (No. 2) 1987, Amendment No. 1

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice, which comes into force on 1 October 1993, amends the Fisheries (Jack Mackerel Quota Management Areas, Total Allowable Catches, and Catch Histories) Notice (No. 2) 1987, by—

- (a) Increasing the total allowable catch for jack mackerel in the Part Auckland (East), Central (East) Area from 5 970 greenweight tonnes to 8 000 greenweight tonnes:
- (b) Increasing the total allowable catch for jack mackerel in the South-East, Southland, Sub-Antarctic Area from 2 700 greenweight tonnes to 9 000 greenweight tonnes.
