This notice is the Family Proceedings (Designated Country) Notice 2002.

This notice comes into force 28 days after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.
- Designated country**
Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China is declared to be a designated country for the purposes of the Family Proceedings Act 1980.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice, which comes into force 28 days after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*, declares Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China to be a designated country for the purposes of the Family Proceedings Act 1980. Maintenance orders made in a designated country may be registered and confirmed in New Zealand.
