PURSUANT to the Forests Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Forest Produce Import and Export Regulations 1966, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Forest Produce Import and Export Regulations 1966* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January

1973.

2. Inspection of forest produce to be exported—Regulation 27 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "Collector of Customs", and substituting the word "Conservator".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The proposed amendment changes the person to whom the costs of inspection of forest produce to be exported are paid. At present those costs are paid to the Collector of Customs. Commencing on 1 January 1973 those costs will be paid to the local Conservator of Forests.
