REGULATIONS 1966, AMENDMENT NO. 6**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 18th day of May 1981

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Forests Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Forest Produce Import and Export Regulations 1966, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Forest Produce Import and Export Regulations 1966* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of June 1981.

2. New Third Schedule—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Third Schedule (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Forest Produce Import and Export Regulations 1966, Amendment No. 4), and substituting the Third Schedule as set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) The Forest Produce Import and Export Regulations 1966, Amendment No. 4, are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

NEW THIRD SCHEDULE TO PRINCIPAL REGULATIONS

"THIRD SCHEDULE

COSTS OF INSPECTING FOREST PRODUCE

The cost of inspecting forest produce imported into or exported from New Zealand shall be calculated at the rate of 44 cents per cubic metre for sawn timber, except that for forest produce in the form of box shooks the cost shall be calculated at the rate of 22 cents per cubic metre, and for forest produce exported in round form the cost shall be calculated at the rate of 14 cents per cubic metre.

COSTS OF STORING FOREST PRODUCE

The cost of storing forest produce shall be calculated at the rate of 68 cents per day for each cubic metre."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase the fees for inspecting and storing forest produce with effect from 1 June 1981.
