

THE FISHERIES (COMMERCIAL PAUA QUOTAS) NOTICE 1984

PURSUANT to section 89 of the Fisheries Act 1983 and to the Fisheries (Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1983, the Minister of Fisheries hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

- 1. Title, commencement, and application—(1) This notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Commercial Paua Quotas) Notice 1984.
- (2) This notice shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*, and shall apply in respect of all paua taken by commercial fishermen during the period commencing on the 1st day of January 1985 and expiring with the 30th day of September 1985.
- **2. Interpretation**—(1) In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - "Central Fishery Management Area" means the Central Fishery Management Area described in the Schedule to the notice declaring fishery management areas as published in the *Gazette* on the 27th day of April 1984 at p. 1402:
 - "Challenger Fishery Management Area" means the Challenger Fishery Management Area described in the Schedule to the notice declaring fishery management areas as published in the *Gazette* on the 27th day of April 1984 at p. 1402:
 - "Greenweight" means the weight of any paua which is in a whole (in the shell) and unprocessed state:
 - "Paua landing return" or "landing return form" means a landing return form supplied to every paua quota holder by the Director-General:
 - "Paua quota zone", with reference to a specific paua quota zone, means that area described in the First Schedule to this notice as that specific paua quota zone:
 - "Paua quota holder" means any commercial fisherman to whom a paua quota has been allocated in the Second Schedule to this notice:

"Southern Fishery Management Area" means the Southern Fishery Management Area described in the Schedule to the notice declaring fishery management areas as published in the *Gazette* on the 27th day of April 1984 at p. 1402:

"Week" means a period of 7 consecutive days ending at midnight on

Sunday.

- (2) Words and expressions in this notice which are defined in the Fisheries Act 1983 or the Fisheries (Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1983* shall, unless the context otherwise requires, have the meanings so defined.
- 3. Allocation of paua quota to specified commercial fishermen—
 (1) There shall be allocated to the commercial fishermen named in the 1st Column of the Second Schedule to this notice so much of the total paua quota prescribed in the Fisheries (Commercial Quotas) Regulations 1984† as appears against their name in the 3rd Column of that Schedule.

(2) Every paua quota holder shall fish for his quota only from the paua quota zone specified for him in the 2nd Column of the Second Schedule

of this notice.

- (3) Every paua quota holder shall cease fishing for paua immediately his quota is filled.
- (4) No paua quota allocated under this notice shall be transferable to any other person.
- **4. Closed areas**—No commercial fisherman (whether a paua quota holder or not) shall take any paua from those waters specified in the Third Schedule to this notice.
- **5. Prohibition on taking paua**—No person shall take any paua from the Central Fishery Management Area, the Challenger Fishery Management Area, or the Southern Fishery Management Area unless that person is a paua quota holder.
- **6. Paua quota holders to furnish landing returns**—(1) Every paua quota holder shall, on every Monday after a week during which his paua quota remains unfilled and on the day after the day his paua quota is filled, complete and forward a paua landing return to the nearest Office of the Ministry or, if a particular office is specified on the landing return form, to that office.
- (2) The return required under subclause (1) of this clause is in addition to, and not in substitution for, any other requirement pursuant to the Act to furnish returns or information to the Ministry.

FIRST SCHEDULE

PAUA QUOTA ZONES

CENTRAL FISHERY MANAGEMENT AREA

Wairarapa-Hastings Paua Quota Zone

All that area of New Zealand fisheries waters lying within 12 nautical miles of the mean high-water mark of the coast of the North Island between a line drawn due East from Cape Turnagain (at 40° 29.5'S and 176° 37.3'E) and, to the South, a line drawn due South from Turakirae Head (at 41° 26.4'S and 174° 54.8'E).

CHALLENGER FISHERY MANAGEMENT AREA

Marlborough-Nelson Paua Quota Zone

All that area of New Zealand fisheries waters lying within 12 nautical miles of the mean high-water mark of the coast of the South Island between a line drawn due East of Clarence Point (at 42° 10′S and 173° 56′E) and, to the West, a line drawn due West from Kahurangi Point (at 40° 46.7′S and 172° 13.2′E).

SOUTHERN FISHERY MANAGEMENT AREA

Chatham Islands Paua Quota Zone

All that area of New Zealand fisheries waters lying within 12 nautical miles of the Chatham Islands and all islands within that group of islands.

Kaikoura-Canterbury Paua Quota Zone

All that area of New Zealand fisheries waters lying within 12 nautical miles of the mean high-water mark of the coast of the South Island between a line drawn due East from Clarence Point (at 42° 10′S and 173° 56′E) and, to the South, a line drawn on a true compass bearing of 135° from the Waitaki River South Head Aero Beacon (at 44° 56.3′S and 171° 08′E).

Otago-Southland Paua Quota Zone

All that area of New Zealand fisheries waters lying within 12 nautical miles of the mean high-water mark of the coasts of the South Island and Stewart Island between a line drawn on a true compass bearing of 135° from the Waitaki River South Head Aero Beacon (at 44° 56.3′S and 171° 08′E) and, to the South and then West, a line drawn due West from Awarua Point (at 44° 16′S and 168° 03′E).

- 1. East Coast—Those waters lying within 12 nautical miles seaward of the mean high-water mark of that part of the shore between Cape Runaway (at 37° 32.3′S and 177° 59.4′E) and Blackhead Lighthouse (at 40° 13.2′S and 176° 47.2′E):
- 2. Palliser Bay—Those waters lying within 12 nautical miles seaward of the mean high-water mark of that part of the shore between Cape Palliser Light (at 41° 36.8′E and 175° 17.4′S) and the entrance of Lake Ferry (at 41° 24′E and 175° 8.4′S):

Challenger Fishery Management Area

3. West Coast—Those waters lying within one nautical mile seaward of the mean high-water mark between Sandhills Creek (at 40° 40.3'S and 172° 23.6'E) and the Patarau River (at 40° 38.6'S and 172° 26.0'E):

Southern Fishery Management Area

- 4. Waikouaiti Bay—The waters of Waikouaiti Bay lying inside a line drawn from Cornish Head (at 45° 37.3′S and 170° 41.6′E) to Karitane Peninsula (at 45° 38.6′S and 170° 40.4′E):
- 5. Seacliff—All those waters lying within ½ nautical mile seaward of the mean high-water mark of that part of the shore between Brunn's Point (at 45° 40.6'S and 170° 39'E) and Omimi (at 45° 41.7'S and 170° 36.7'E):
- 6. Otago Harbour—The waters of Otago Harbour lying inside a straight line drawn from Heywards Point (at 45° 45.4′S and 170° 41.4′E) to Taiaroa Head (at 45° 46.5′S and 170° 43.6′E):
- 7. Otago-Peninsula—All those waters lying within ½ nautical mile seaward of the mean high water mark between Cape Saunders Lighthouse (at 45° 53'S and 170° 43.8'E) and the point one nautical mile south of Brighton (at 45° 57.5'S and 170° 18.2'E):
- 8. Taieri River Mouth—All those waters lying within ½ nautical mile seaward of the mean high-water mark between the point one nautical mile north of the Taieri River mouth (at 46° 02.5'S and 170° 13.2'E) and the point one nautical mile south of the Taieri River mouth (at 46° 04.5'S and 170° 12.3'E) (including Taieri Island):
- 9. *Tokomairiro River*—All those waters lying within ½ nautical mile seaward of the mean high-water mark between the point one nautical mile north of the Tokomairiro River mouth (at 46° 12.5′ S and 170° 03.5′ E) and the point one nautical mile south of the Tokomairiro River mouth (at 46° 13.6′ S and 170° 02′ E):
- 10. Clutha River—All those waters lying within ½ nautical mile seaward of the mean high-water mark between Newstead (at 46° 19.45'S and 169° 53'E) and the Port Molyneux School (at 46° 22.3'S and 169° 46.5'E):

- 11. Tautuku Peninsula—All those waters lying within ½ nautical mile seaward of the mean high-water mark from the point 46° 35.5′ and 169° 25.6′E in the north, and 46° 36.8′S and 169° 24.2′E in the south (including all islets and outcrops):
- 12. Waipapa-Riverton—All those waters lying within ½ nautical mile seaward of the mean high-water mark between Waipapa Point Lighthouse (at 46° 39.7'S and 168° 51'E) and Howells Point, Riverton (at 46° 23.5'S and 168° 02.2'E) (including all islets and outcrops):
- 13. Doubtful Sound—The headwaters of Doubtful Sound lying inside a straight line drawn from Joseph Point (at 45° 19'S and 166° 57.4'E) to Espinona Point (at 45° 16.5'S and 167° E):
- 14. Milford Sound—The waters of Milford Sound lying inside a straight line drawn from St Anne's Point (at 44° 34.5'S and 167° 47.1'E) to Stripe Point (at 44° 32.4'S and 167° 48.8'E):
- 15. Stewart Island—Those waters of Stewart Island lying inside a straight line drawn from Mamaku Point (at 46° 51.8′S and 168° 06.3′E) to Bullers Point (The Neck) (at 46° 55.5′S and 168° 10.2′E):
- 16. Ruapuke Island—All those waters lying within one nautical mile seaward of the mean high-water mark of Ruapuke Island.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice allocates individual paua quotas to commercial fishermen in the Central, Challenger, and Southern Fishery Management Areas.

Closed areas are declared, and quota holders are required to furnish landing returns.
