**THE FISHERIES (GENERAL) REGULATIONS 1950,
AMENDMENT NO. 19**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 4th day of September 1972

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 19, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Use of Danish seine net by more than 1 vessel—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 69, and substituting the following regulation:

“69. (1) No person shall use any net that is drawn over the sea bottom, or through the sea, or hauled, by more than 1 vessel, or by means of any mechanical device whether from a vessel or from the shore, in any of the following waters:

“(a) Any waters in which the use of a Danish seine net is for the time being forbidden; or

“(b) Any waters inside a straight line drawn from Cape Rodney to the easternmost point of Tawharanui Peninsula; or

“(c) Any waters bounded by a straight line drawn from Kawau Point to the lighthouse on Tiritiri Matangi Island; thence by straight line to Thumb Point on Waiheke Island; thence by straight line to the westernmost point of Motuoruhi island; thence by straight line to the westernmost point of Motukahaua island; thence by straight line to the commencing point at Kawau Point; or

“(d) Any waters bounded by a straight line drawn from Kaiiti at the southern entrance to Port Jackson to the westernmost point of Motukahaua island; thence by straight line to Tokotorea at the northern entrance to Colville Bay; thence by high-water mark in a north-westerly direction to the point of intersection with the straight line drawn from Kaiiti to the westernmost point of Motukahaua island; or

“(e) At any time during the period commencing with the 1st day of October in any year and ending with the last day of February in the next following year, in any waters bounded by a straight line drawn from Cape Rodney to the easternmost point of Tawharanui Peninsula; thence by straight line to the easternmost point of Kawau Island; thence by high-water mark of the eastern side of Kawau Island to Kawau Point; thence by straight line to the westernmost point of Motukahaua island; thence by straight line to Kaiiti at the southern entrance to Port Jackson; thence by high-water mark in an easterly and northerly direction to Cape Colville; thence by straight line to the commencing point at Cape Rodney.

“(2) The reference points named in this regulation are shown on charts N.Z. 522 and N.Z. 532.”

(2) Regulation 77 of the principal regulations is hereby consequentially amended by adding to the proviso the words “being drawn over the sea bottom, or through the sea, or hauled, by not more than 1 vessel.”

3. Using Danish seine net in North Island waters—Regulation 72 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 3 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 16) is hereby amended by revoking subclauses (10) to (15), and substituting the following subclause and its heading:

“Hauraki Gulf and the Firth of Thames

“(10) The waters of Hauraki Gulf and the Firth of Thames inside a straight line drawn from the easternmost point of Tawharanui Peninsula to the easternmost point of Kawau Island; thence by high-water mark of the eastern side of Kawau Island to Kawau Point; thence by straight line to the lighthouse on Tiritiri Matangi Island; thence by straight line to Thumb Point on Waiheke Island; thence by straight line to the western extremity of Motuoruhi island; thence by straight line to the western extremity of Motukahaua island; thence by straight line to Tokotorea at the northern entrance to Colville Bay. The reference points named in this subclause are shown on charts N.Z. 522 and N.Z. 532.”

4. Revocation—Regulation 3 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 16, is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950, by redefining the areas in which the use of Danish seine nets is prohibited.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936.

These regulations are administered in the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.
