**THE FISHERIES (GENERAL) REGULATIONS 1950,  
AMENDMENT NO. 23**

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 23, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Interpretation**—Regulation 4 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the definition of “high-water mark”, the following definition:

“‘Kina’ means sea egg.”.

**3. Restrictions on number of shellfish that may be taken on any 1 day**—(1) Regulation 106k of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 5 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 18) is hereby amended by omitting the table in subclause (1), and substituting the following table:

(2) The said regulation 106κ is hereby further amended by omitting the table in subclause (2), and substituting the following table:

(3) The said regulation 106κ is hereby further amended by inserting in subclause (5A) (as amended by regulation 10 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 20) after the word “mussels”, the word “kina”.

**4. Metric amendment**—(1) Regulation 12 (2) of the principal regulations (as inserted by regulation 2 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 21, and amended by regulation 6 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 22) is hereby further amended by omitting the expression “105 mm” from every place where it occurs, and substituting in each case the expression “165 mm”.

(2) So much of the Schedule to the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 22 as relates to regulation 12 (2) of the principal regulations is hereby consequentially revoked.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations amend the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950. The main effect is to impose a limit on the number of kina (sea eggs) that may be taken by any person on any 1 day, and provide for greater quantities to be taken by any person on behalf of a Maori Committee or a District Maori Council, for the purposes of a tangi or hui, if certain conditions are complied with.

The metric amendment corrects a typographical error in Amendment No. 22 of the principal regulations.
