ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 5th day of November 1979

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

**1. Title**—These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 32, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

**2. Commencement and expiry**—(1) Subject to subclause (2) of this regulation, these regulations shall come into force on the 8th day of November 1979.

(2) The amendments to the principal regulations effected by regulation 3 of these regulations shall come into force on the 3rd day after the Director-General, by notice published in a daily newspaper circulating generally within the districts adjoining Tasman Bay, has declared he is satisfied that, commencing on the 8th day of November 1979, approximately 1,000 tonnes of snapper have been taken by registered fishing vessels from those waters lying inside a straight line drawn from the easternmost point of Farewell Spit to Cape Stephens.

(3) These regulations shall expire with the close of the last day of February 1980.

3. Certain fishing methods prohibited in part of Tasman Bay—  
(1) Regulation 4 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the definition of the term “take”, the following definition:

“Tasman Bay Fisheries Management Area’ means those waters of Tasman Bay lying inside a straight line drawn from the northwesternmost point of Pepin Island to the easternmost extremity of Adele Island; thence by high-water mark in a westerly direction to the northernmost point of Adele Island; thence to the nearest point of the mainland:”.

(2) Regulation 69 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 9 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 26) is hereby amended—

(a) By adding to subclause (3) the words “or in the Tasman Bay Fisheries Management Area”:

(b) By inserting in subclause (4) after the word “Area”, the words “or in the Tasman Bay Fisheries Management Area”:

(c) By inserting in subclause (5) (b) after the words “these regulations”, the words “except in the Tasman Bay Fisheries Management Area”.

(3) Regulation 72 (25) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the words “or within the Tasman Bay Fisheries Management Area”.

(4) Regulation 77 (3) of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 13 of the Fisheries (General) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 26) is hereby amended by adding the words “or in the Tasman Bay Fisheries Management Area”.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations prohibit—

(a) Danish seining:

(b) Multiple vessel power net fishing:

(c) Mechanically operated surrounding net fishing for snapper—

in the Tasman Bay Fisheries Management Area. The prohibition starts when a snapper quota of 1,000 tonnes taken from the whole of Tasman Bay is exceeded and finishes with the expiry of the regulations on 29 February 1980.
