HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 75 of the Films Act 1983, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Films Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Films Regulations 1984* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 19th day of September 1988.
- 2. Fees inclusive of goods and services tax—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 24, the following regulation:
- "24A. The fees specified in the Second Schedule to these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985."

- **3.** New scale of fees substituted—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Films Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.
- **4. Revocation**—The Films Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 1 are hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

waive the whole or any part of this fee for such number of copies of any such certificate as he or she thinks fit."

These regulations, which come into force on 19 September 1988, increase the fees payable for various matters relating to the exemption, examination, and registration of films under the Films Act 1983.

The fees prescribed in respect of other matters remain the same, but, like the fees that are increased, now include goods and services tax.

Regulation 2 inserts a new regulation 24A in the principal regulations. The new regulation makes it clear that all the fees prescribed by the principal regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax.
