HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 42 of the Food Act 1981, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Food Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Food Regulations 1984* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1990.
- 2. Margarine—Regulation 88 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Food Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 3) is hereby amended—
 - (a) By omitting from subclause (6) the words "at least 75%", and substituting the expression "100%":
 - (b) By revoking subclause (7):

(c) By omitting from subclause (10) the expression "(7),".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 January 1990, are designed to ensure that margarine is not described as a dairy product unless 100% of the fat content is milk fat.
