



## THE FOOD REGULATIONS 1984, AMENDMENT NO. 4

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 18th day of December 1989

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 42 of the Food Act 1981, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

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### REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Food Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Food Regulations 1984\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1990.

**2. Margarine**—Regulation 88 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Food Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 3) is hereby amended—

- (a) By omitting from subclause (6) the words “at least 75%”, and substituting the expression “100%”;
- (b) By revoking subclause (7):

(c) By omitting from subclause (10) the expression “(7),”.

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EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on 1 January 1990, are designed to ensure that margarine is not described as a dairy product unless 100% of the fat content is milk fat.
